



I'll Have What He's Having

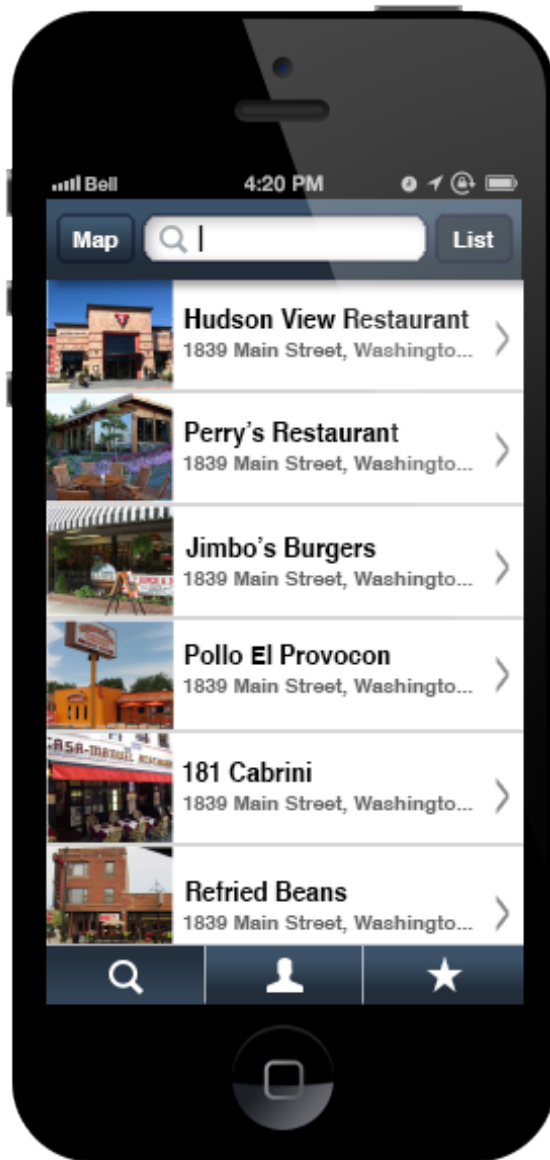

Inspired by a trip to Vermont where a friend ordered an unlisted menu item by simply telling the waitress "I'll have what he's having" this app aims to help you discover menu items at your favorite restaurants that you didn't even know existed.



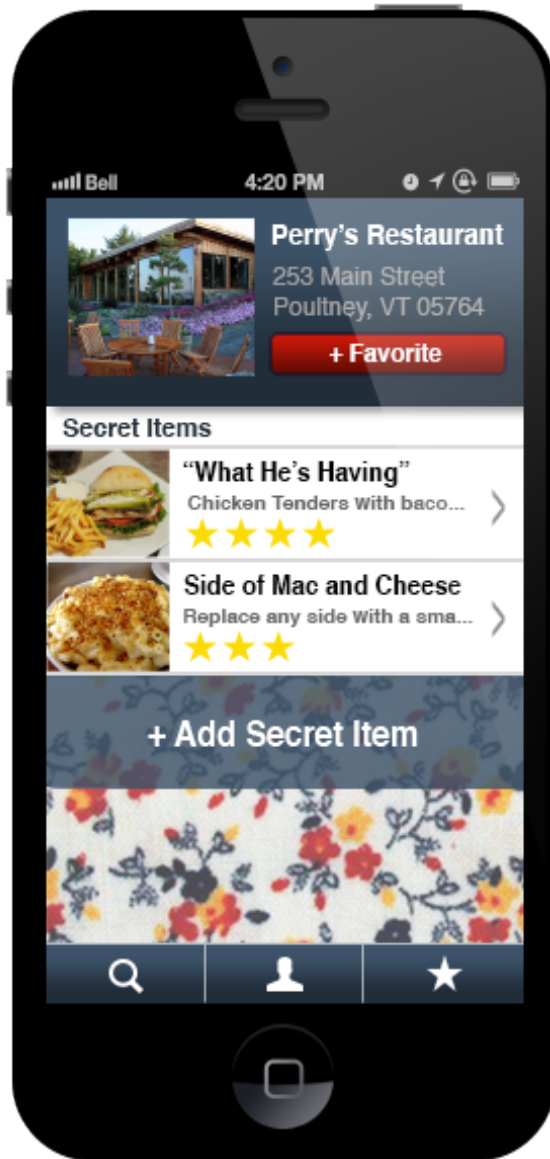
Map Search

When the app loads this is your initial screen. Using your GPS it will load initially with results closest to where you are so searching is easy from there. Ideally when using this app you will already be sitting in the restaurant you wish to search for items making this search method the most intuitive.



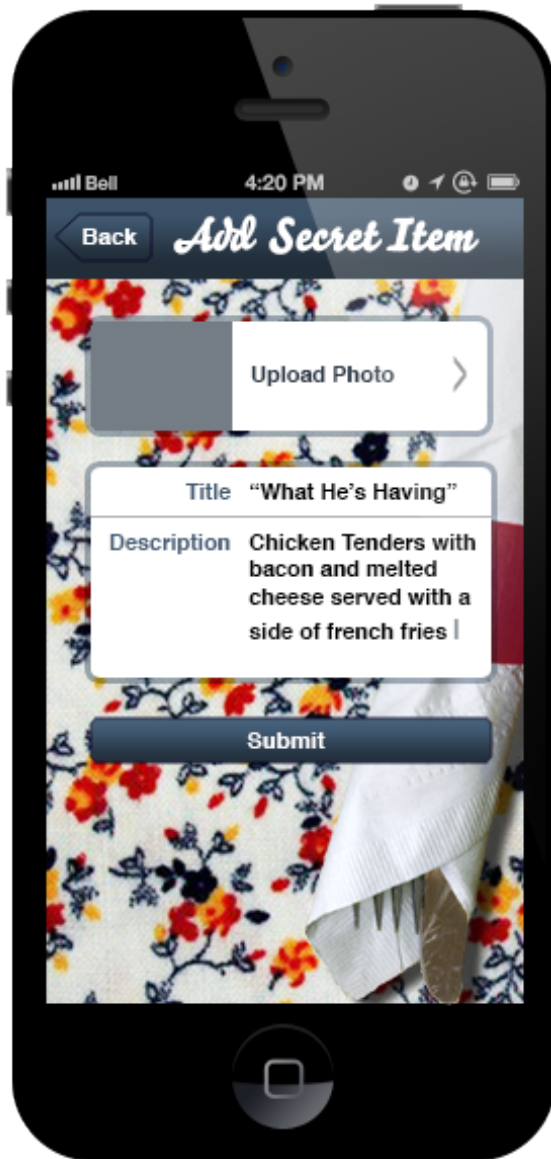
List Search

This method of searching is reached through the map search page. You can toggle between map and list view to find the restaurant you are in for fast and easy searching. Restaurants will exist whether they have menu items in them or not by using foursquare's (or a similar app's) API.



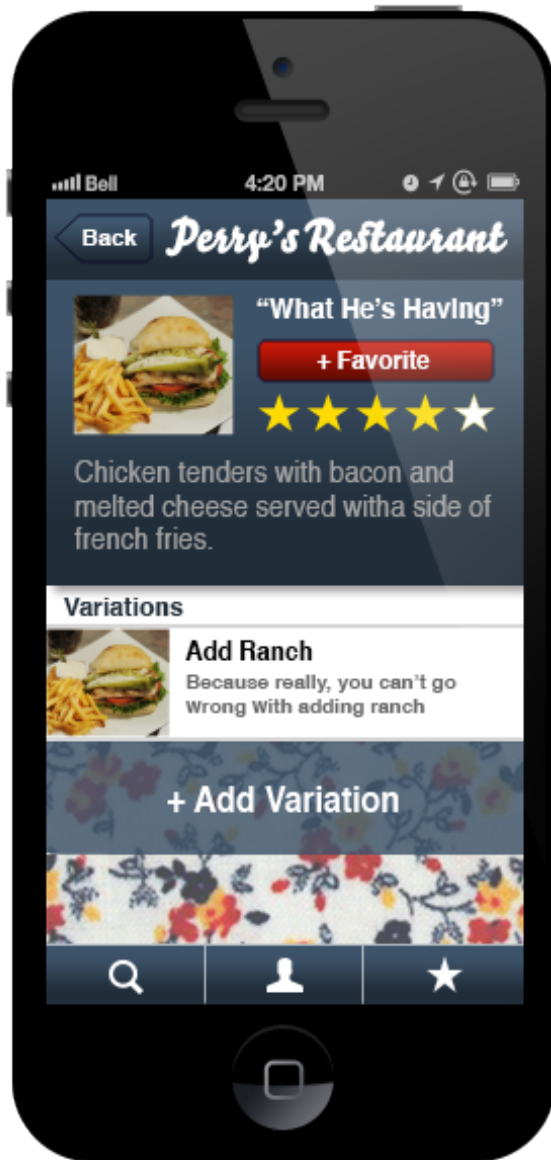
Restaurant Page

Once you select the restaurant you are in you will be taken to that restaurant's page. On the restaurant's page you can add the restaurant to your favorites to easily access it later. If you see a secret menu item you might be interested in you can select that item for more information or to add your own variation of that item. After scrolling through the available secret menu items you then have the option to add your own secret item if it is not already on that restaurant's list.



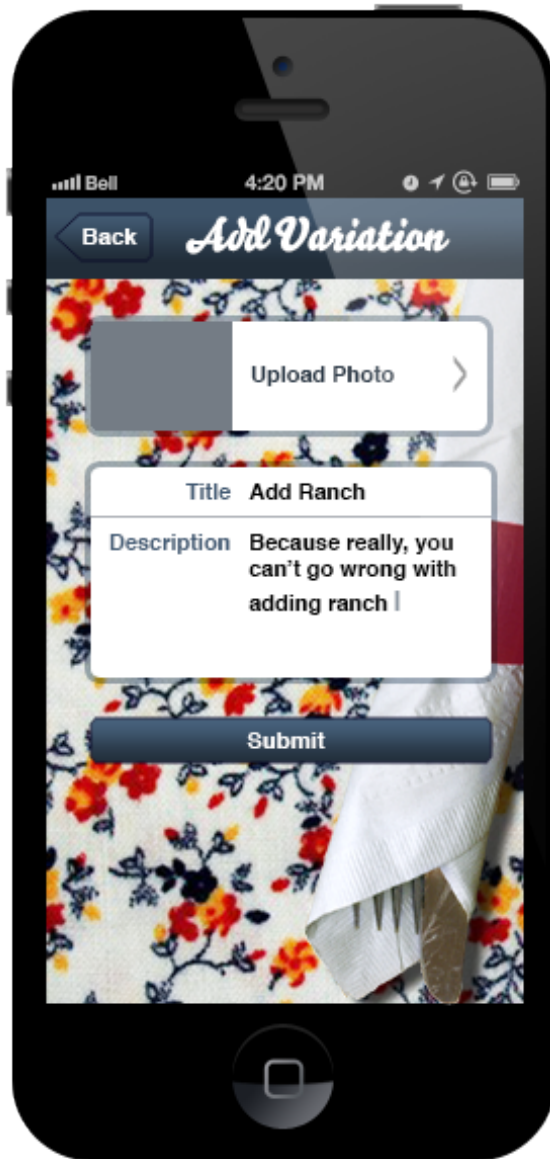
Add Secret Item

The ability to add your own secret item can be accessed through any restaurant page. You have three fields to update about that item: a photo, a title, and a brief description. Once you fill in these fields clicking submit will add the item to that restaurant's page.



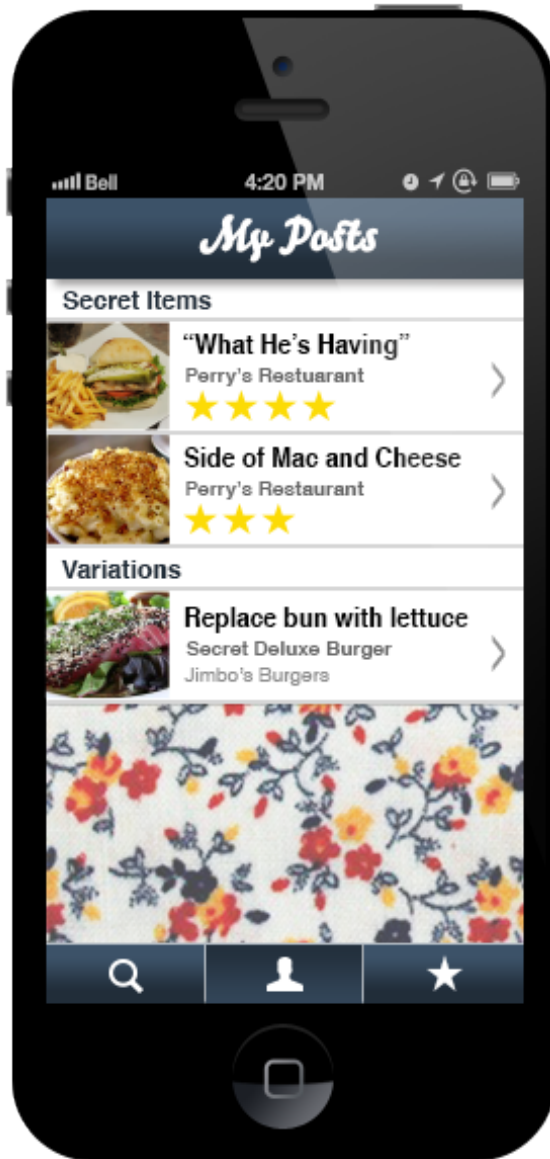
Secret Item

After selecting an item through any restaurant page you will be taken to that item's page for more information. On an item page you may add a variation of that item, add an item to your favorites, and rate that item (this is the only place in which items are rated, everywhere else is the overall average rating). Variations cannot be favorited or rated but are more suggestions of different ways to order the item from other users.



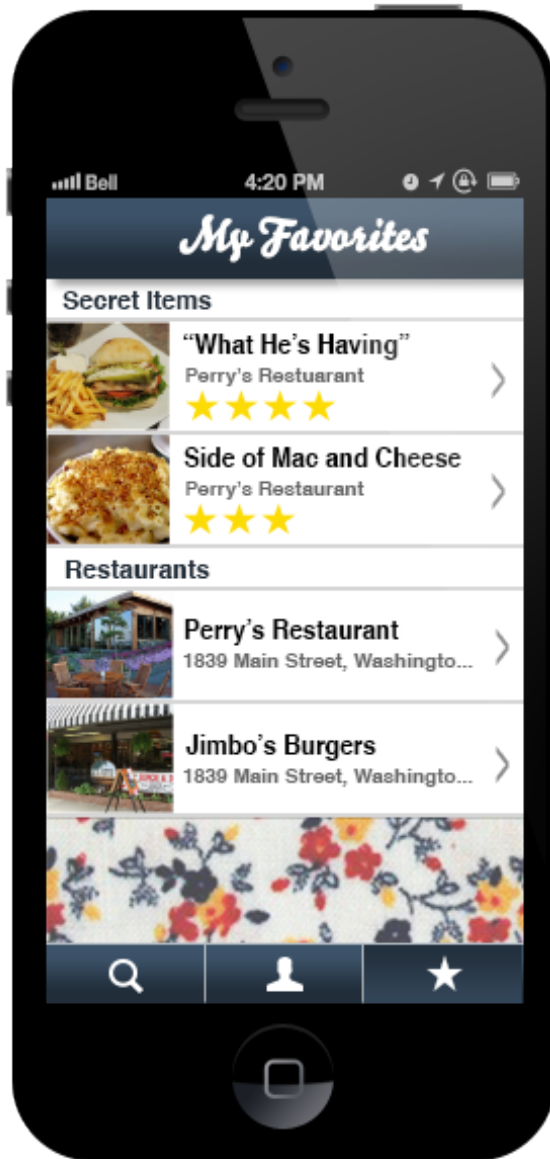
Add Variation

Adding a variation is very similar to adding an item. The main difference is there is a character limit on the description due to variations not having their own pages.



My Posts

My Posts can be accessed at any time via the middle icon on the tab navigation at the bottom of the screen. My posts keeps track of items and variations you have posted so that over time you can see how they are rated or other variations of your times that other users add.



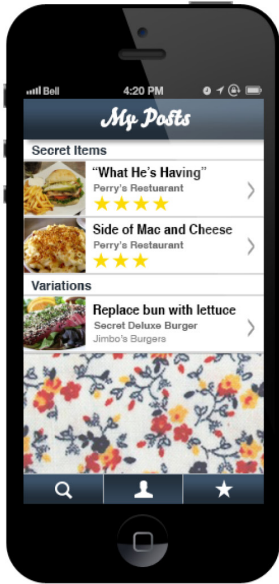
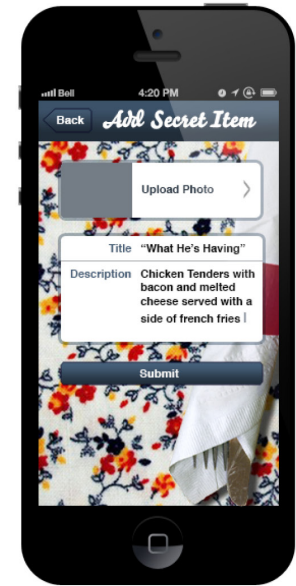
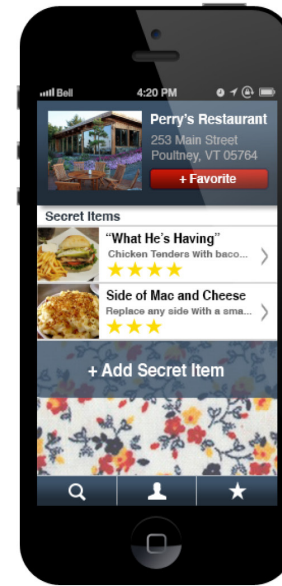
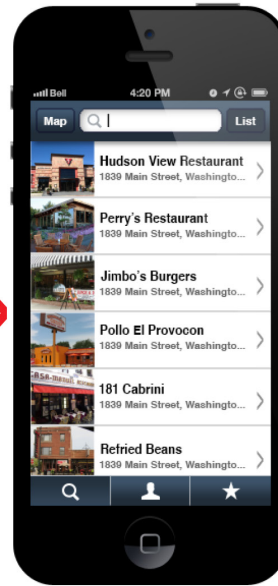
My Favorites

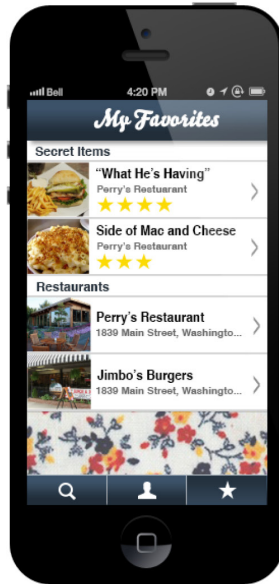

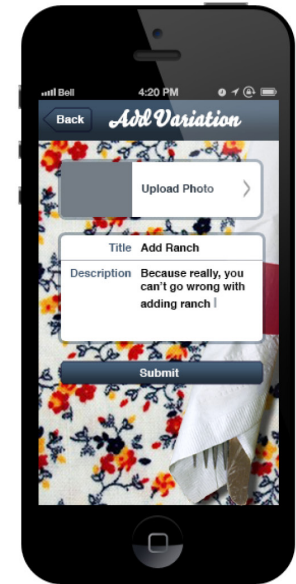
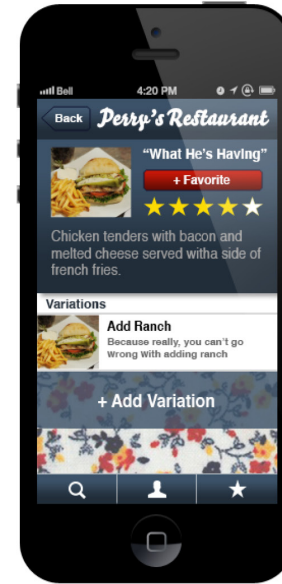
