

How might we design a tool to assist singers with hearing loss to independently help themselves develop sense of musical pitch and sing confidently?

How to sing on pitch in a music group (chorus, singing class)?

People with normal hearing can do these:

- 1. Recognize pitches from our own voice
- 2. Recognize pitches from voices of other reference (other people / accompanying instrument)
- 3. **Tell the difference** between our own voice & voices of other reference
- 4. **Adjust** our own voice to match other reference
- 5. Get used to the correct pitch interval and sing better next time

But, if you're hard of hearing, you have to find other ways.

User (hearing loss singers) 's Goals & Needs

Goal

- · Have the ability to train themselves to sing confidently while rehearsal/performing
- · Have the ability to develop sense of musical pitches

Needs

- · Needs to figure out what they have to do to fix it when they sing out of tune (higher? lower? how much?)
- · Needs to focus on how to better develop sense of music pitches when practicing
- · Needs to memorize the physical feeling of correct pitches when singing
- · Needs to **practice independently** (instead of relying on assistance from other singers with normal hearing)
- · Needs an assistive listening device which is
 - · A augmentation tool when user is reading music scores while practicing singing
 - Easy to use / learn

Scenario: Pre-rehearsal Practice

Goal

- · Independently self-practice before rehearsal
- · Have the ability to train themselves and evaluate the result
- Get familiar with the physical feeling before rehearsal/performance
- · Gain confidence & reduce nervousness during rehearsal/performance

- iPhone
- Apple watch


